



ALISON WALKER



Alison is a retired Primary school teacher, has worked in Tourism for 10 years and has cycled/camped around much of the world. She is a keen trumper and has hiked much of the Te Araroa trail through NZ. She is committed to improving biodiversity on both Aotea and Waiheke Island.

For 15 years Alison has worked on the family's 33ha property, a buffer between Hirakimata and Rakitu Island. They have established 5kms of tracks that support year round trapping and have planted hundreds of local native trees. The family has been supported by a committed environmentalist Stuart Farquhar.

Alison applied for funding and set up the Trap library on Aotea which lends out rodent traps and stations to the community with the goal of improving the habitat of our native birds and insects.
